In Cuyahoga County of uninsured individuals are wo hork full-time


445,689 people in Cuyahoga County are on Medicaid. Medicaid is a healthcare insurance program for individuals and families with limited income.<sup>2</sup>





People of color are more likely than white people to have higher incidence of chronic conditions like asthma, diabetes, high blood pressure, and heart disease. And for people of color, those conditions are also more likely to be life-threatening.<sup>3</sup>

Local research found a strong correlation between communities with more hourly workers and lower vaccination rates, more than race or ethnicity alone, implying a connection around fear of missing work or lack of PTO.4

#### **Employer Practices**

- Offer Affordable Employee Health Insurance at time of hire
- Employer contributions to Flexible Spending Accounts (FSA) and Health Spending Accounts (HSA)

- Reimagine health insurance coverage





## LOCAL SPOTLIGHT:

The Dollars for Doses Campaign, developed by Greater Cleveland Congregations and expanded by other Cleveland organizations, provided cash incentives to individuals who participated in COVID-19 vaccine clinics. The \$100 helped residents overcome vaccine hesitancy and opportunity costs, like missing work for the vaccine appointment or side effects, and then falling short on monthly bills. Vaccine clinics occurred at churches and community centers
